Beginning in the 1980s,
China focused for two
decades on "hiding
capabilities and biding
time." After the 2008
Global Financial Crisis,
it became more assertive
regionally, following a
policy of "actively
accomplishing
something." Finally, in
the aftermath populist
elections of 2016, China
shifted to an even more
aggressive strategy for
undermining US hegemony,
adopting the phrase
"great changes unseen in
century." After charting
how China's long game
has evolved, Doshi
offers a comprehensive
yet asymmetric plan for
an effective US
response. Ironically,
his proposed approach
takes a page from
Beijing's own strategic
playbook to undermine
China's ambitions and
strengthen American

order without competing dollar-for-dollar, ship-for-ship, or loan-for-loan.

progress. The goal of ending extreme poverty by 2030, already at risk before the pandemic, is now beyond reach in the absence of swift, significant, and sustained action, and the objective of advancing shared prosperity—raising the incomes of the poorest 40 percent in each country—will be much more difficult. Poverty and Shared Prosperity 2020: Reversals of Fortune presents new estimates of COVID-19's impacts on global poverty and shared prosperity. Harnessing fresh data from frontline surveys and economic simulations, it shows that pandemic-related job losses and deprivation worldwide are hitting already poor and vulnerable people hard, while also shifting the profile of global poverty to include millions of 'new poor.' Original analysis included in the report shows that the new poor are more urban, better educated, and less likely to work in

agriculture than those living in extreme poverty before COVID-19. It also gives new estimates of the impact of conflict and climate change, and how they overlap. These results are important for targeting policies to safeguard lives and livelihoods. It shows how some countries are acting to reverse the crisis, protect those most vulnerable, and promote a resilient recovery. These findings call for urgent action. If the global response fails the world's poorest and most vulnerable people now, the losses they have experienced to date will be minimal compared with what lies ahead. Success over the long term will require much more than stopping COVID-19. As efforts to curb the disease and its economic fallout intensify, the interrupted development agenda in low- and middle-income countries must be put back on track. Recovering from today's reversals of fortune requires

tackling the economic crisis unleashed by COVID-19 with a commitment proportional to the crisis itself. In doing so, countries can also plant the seeds for dealing with the long-term development challenges of promoting inclusive growth, capital accumulation, and risk prevention—particularly the risks of conflict and climate change.
