There are also other various restrictions that are detailed below for them under the SPECIAL FISHING REGULATIONS section. The lakes and ponds are listed starting with the Bronx (Bronx County), Manhattan (New York County), Staten Island (Richmond County), Brooklyn (Kings County) and then Queens and Queens County. There is very limited stream or creek fishing in the city, better out in Nassau and Suffolk Counties on Long Island or
