The Importance of Demographic and Geographical Factors on the Incidence and Outcome of Systemic Small Vessel Vasculitis Associated with Anti-Neutrophil Cytoplasmic Antibodies - Maria Weiner 2019-11-04

The anti-neutrophil cytoplasmic antibody (ANCA)-associated vasculitides (AAV) comprise microscopic polyangiitis (MPA), granulomatosis with polyangiitis (GPA) and eosinophilic granulomatosis with polyangiitis (EGPA). Two serotypes are recognized: myeloperoxidase (MPO)-ANCA and proteinase 3 (PR3)-ANCA. Renal involvement is a common and severe manifestation associated with increased mortality. The incidence varies geographically, but studies are difficult to compare due to heterogeneous methodology and inclusion criteria. AAV is commonly found in the elderly, but there are little data on outcome and optimal treatment in the highest age groups. This thesis focuses on the epidemiology of AAV: incidence, geographical distribution, and outcome. In Paper I annual incidence rates and outcome were compared between nephritis in AAV and nephritis in systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE) in two geographically defined populations in Sweden. Even though SLE is twice as common as AAV, ANCA-associated nephritis outnumbered lupus nephritis by three to one, and was significantly more severe in terms of mortality and development of end stage renal disease. In Paper II associations between ANCA serotype and geographical and demographic factors were investigated in a large multi-centre study of 1408 patients with renal biopsy-proven AAV. PR3-ANCA was associated with male gender, younger age and higher glomerular filtration rate. PR3-ANCA was also associated with higher latitude and lower ultraviolet radiation levels, but analyses of subgroups suggested that genetic rather than environmental explanations might be more important for this geographical gradient. In Paper III a consecutive cohort of 151 elderly patients with MPA and GPA was studied with a focus on treatment, mortality and renal survival. Patients who had received

immunosuppressive treatment with cyclophosphamide or rituximab had better survival rates compared to less intensively treated or untreated patients. Severely impaired renal function at diagnosis was associated with worse outcome in terms of both patient and renal survival. In Paper IV the elderly cohort was extended to 202 patients. In this study we found that treatment with cyclophosphamide or rituximab was associated with the development of less permanent organ damage, and not with higher utilization of in-hospital care. Royal Hawaiian Featherwork - Leah Pualahaole Caldeira 2015-08-31

Painstakingly constructed by hand of plant fiber and precious feathers from endemic birds of Hawai‘i, feather cloaks and capes provided spiritual protection to Hawaiian chiefs for centuries while proclaiming their royal status. Few of the artworks known as *nā hulu ali‘i*, or royal feathers, survive today except in museums and private collections. Through photographs and scholarly essays, *Royal Hawaiian Featherwork* highlights approximately seventy-five rare examples of the finest featherwork capes and cloaks (*‘ahu‘ula*) extant, as well as royal staffs of feathers (*kāhili*), feather lei (*lei hulu manu*), helmets (*mahiole*), feathered god images (*akua hulu manu*), and related eighteenth- and nineteenth-century paintings and works on paper. With their brilliant coloring and abstract compositions of crescents, triangles, circles, quadrilaterals, and lines, the artworks are both beautiful and rich in cultural significance. In the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, featherworks were key items of indigenous Hawaiian diplomacy, used to secure political alliances and agreements, worn as battlefield regalia, and seized as spoils from defeated chiefs. Later, in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, the featherworks—used in trading and gifts to foreign visitors—became symbols of Hawaiian heritage and cultural pride. This stunningly illustrated volume also serves as the catalogue to accompany the first exhibition of Hawaiian featherwork to be staged on the U.S. continent, scheduled for a six-month run starting in late August 2015 at the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco. The book and exhibition provide an overdue opportunity for the public to discover the central role these artworks played in the culture and history of the Hawaiian Islands, to explore their unparalleled technical craftsmanship, and to discover an aesthetic tradition unique to the Hawaiian archipelago. Revenge was just one of the catalysts responsible for the disposal of the Australian Commonwealth Shipping Line to Great Britain. In reality the final sale was a gift to a conglomerate of British shipowners; five new passenger ships and two large special purpose vessels all that remained of 57 ships. Ships sold for little more than their scrap value with a small down payment followed by default. 28men depicts an explosive period of endemic industrial disputation, the near general strike that crippled New South Wales in 1917. During this volatile period of strikes, union power, political intrigues and a world at war, there emerged from near anarchy a conservative cohesion of political forces within the Australian government. A coalition of Nationalist and Country Party had ample justification to crush the union movement; the Moreton Bay debacle as flagship of the Sydney Harbour Regatta, the Bass Strait ferry Loongana near tragedy, and the doomed union struggle against the introduction of a foreign time and motion regime. On a permanent confrontational footing strode the Wobblies through the shambles, Industrial Workers of the World who fearlessly fought the establishment with sometimes disastrous results. Out of this turmoil a chance meeting in New York between a young Australian seaman and an I.W.W. organiser grew a love story as turbulent as the period.
