After she married the political theorist and author Leonard Woolf in 1912, they went on to found the Hogarth Press. Virginia

also had a long relationship with the writer Vita Sackville-West. The affair featured in the 2018 movie *Vita and Virginia*, starring Gemma Arterton and Elizabeth Debicki. Her best-known works include the novels *'Mrs Dalloway'*, *'To the Lighthouse'* and *'Orlando'*.
