The apparently simple but penetrating portraits by Seif Wanli add an extra, distinctive dimension to this already

intriguing book. They originally appeared with the serialized texts in the television magazine, but were omitted when the book was first published in 1972, and were also omitted when the English translation first appeared in 1977. Now, in this special edition, the pictures and the complete text appear together for the first time.
