In dit boekje presenteert Tanja Janssen een didactische aanpak, gebaseerd op het principe van 'dialogisch leren'. De methode

suggesties voor mogelijke oplossingen. Ten slotte presenteert Janssen enkele varianten op de didactische aanpak: met andere literaire genres, in andere leerjaren en bij andere schoolvakken dan het schoolvak Nederlands.
