Generalmente la figura de Teobaldo Power se relaciona con el compositor, autor de los Cantos Canarios y otras obras para piano y, aunque en menor medida, con el gran pianista que era considerado en su época. Sin embargo, hasta ahora su actividad docente había quedado olvidada. Teobaldo Power fue un gran pedagogo del piano y poseía unos conocimientos relativos a la interpretación y la docencia que justificaba con argumentos sólidos y muy adelantados a su época. Diseñó su propio sistema de enseñanza para corregir las múltiples carencias pedagógicas que sobre todo la enseñanza privada poseía; sin embargo, debido a su repentina muerte todo quedó en un proyecto. El lector en esta obra descubrirá muchos aspectos sobre Teobaldo Power en las facetas de intérprete, compositor y, en especial, pedagogo. De la primera obtendrá numerosa información sobre su estilo interpretativo; de su faceta como compositor, una enumeración más completa de sus obras -algunas de ellas habían permanecido totalmente en el olvido-; y de su

actividad docente, la pedagogía que aplicó durante los años que ocupó la plaza de profesor numerario en la Escuela Nacional de Música y Declamación y el sistema de enseñanza que deseaba llevar a cabo.

Based on a wealth of new and previously overlooked documentary evidence, this biography debunks the mythology surrounding Albeniz's

career--much of it spun by the composer himself--and reveals a complex individual who was able to capture the mystery of Spain in his music yet who in reality felt estranged from his homeland.

Though incomplete at the time of his death in 1849, Chopin's *Projet de méthode* was nonetheless revolutionary in many respects. But with his *Fundamental Pattern*, Chopin announced the recognition, if not discovery, of the keyboard's extraordinary topographical symmetry and postulated a core formulation for a new "pianistic" pedagogy. More than a hundred years later the now-legendary Heinrich Neuhaus would passionately plead for this pedagogy and a pianism rooted in it. *Natural Fingering* explores this remarkable symmetry, significantly as it sheds light on fingering matters for the now vast catalogue of repertoire. It also examines the revolutionary impact of equal temperament on compositional key choice as well as the liberating influence of Charles Eschmann-Dumur's unique discoveries regarding symmetrical inversion. Author Jon Verbalis develops principles for a topographically-based fingering strategy that reflect a surprising compatibility of this fixed symmetrical organization with the most efficient biokinetic capabilities of the pianist's playing mechanism. He addresses previously neglected or overlooked technical aspects of pianism as they relate to movement in keyboard space generally as well as fingering specifically. Symmetrical fingerings

for all the fundamental forms are presented in innovative, instructive format. The reader will also find an unusually extensive, in-depth discussion of double note challenges. Answering Neuhaus's call for the reappraisal of a certain pedagogical status quo, several chapters are devoted to the relevant implications of Chopin's *Fundamental Pattern*. The author also advances guidelines for a progressive implementation of natural fingering principles from the very start, as well as "retooling" for teachers and students alike. Of special note are the cross-hand major and minor scales for the earliest stages, in which the necessity of thumb under/hand over pivoting actions is eliminated. *Natural Fingering* is the first comprehensive discussion of fingering solutions for pianists since Hummel's monumental treatise of 1828. The book is complemented by a companion website, which serves as a supplement to the printed edition. The website features copious excerpts from the extant repertoire, extended discussions on relevant topics, and a comprehensive manual of the fundamental forms with symmetrically adjusted fingerings.
