ENCOURAGED BY THE PROGRESSIVE WHEATLEYS WHO RECOGNISED HER INCREDIBLE

LITERARY TALENT, SHE WROTE "TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE" WHEN SHE WAS 14 AND BY 20 HAD FOUND PATRONAGE IN THE FORM OF SELINA HASTINGS, COUNTESS OF HUNTINGDON. HER WORKS GARNERED ACCLAIM IN BOTH ENGLAND AND THE COLONIES AND SHE BECAME THE FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN TO MAKE A LIVING AS A POET.
