 Definition An integral equation is an equation in which an unknown function

appears under one or more integral signs. Naturally, in such an equation there can occur other terms as well. For example, for  $a \leq s \leq b$ ;  $a \leq t \leq b$ , the equations (1.1.1)  $f(s) = \int_a^b K(s, t)g(t)dt$ , (1.1.2)  $g(s) = f(s) + \int_a^b K(s, t)g(t)dt$ , (1.1.3)  $g(s) = \int_a^b K(s, t)[g(t)f(t)dt]$ , where the function  $g(s)$  is the unknown function and all the other functions are known, are integral equations. These functions may be complex-valued functions of the real variables  $s$  and  $t$ .
