Transportation systems have a significant place in the development of societies. These systems can turn traffic into a complicated problem as they encompass increased number of population and vehicles, selection of vehicle, selection of business and accommodation and capacity of the roads. Parallel to the problems related to the transportation systems, urban traffic cause several negative externalities such as air pollution, noise pollution, visual pollution, energy waste, avoidance of social integration and health related issues. These negative externalities turn urban areas far from places of living with regard to meeting casual and social needs. However, elimination of problems related to urban transportation systems, indispensable part of daily life, and increase spatial consumption in areas such as work, education, holiday, shopping and sightseeing. Urban transportation is actually more than a transportation problem. It is rather answers to the questions "What sort of a city life we desire" and "Could we create the city life we want?". Since transportation services can't be stored and it has

close ties with other industries, it must be designed and provided according to the needs of societal necessities and when it is required. However, while producers and consumers determine their decisions based on the market conditions in general economy, consumers conduct special benefit analysis, producers conduct special cost analysis and they disregard societal benefit and costs. The purpose of this study is to put forward negative and positive externalities that affect cities in Turkey in general and Canakkale as a case study with respect to urban transportation systems by using literature review and a qualitative research method. The answer sought for the argument in the study is to discuss how negative externalities can be decreased if not eliminated and how positive externalities can be increased with regard to "sustainable urban transportation system". Threat of organic and inorganic life by negative externalities caused by urban transportation systems also increases the significance of the subject day by day. Toplumların sosyo-ekonomik gelişiminde önemli bir payı olan ulaşım hizmeti; nüfus ve araç sayısındaki artış, araç seçimi, işletme ve konut yeri seçimi, yolların kapasitesi gibi birçok nedenden dolayı kentlerde trafiği bir sorun haline getirmektedir. Oysa bu sorunlardan arındırılmış bir kent içi ulaşım hizmeti, gürültü ve sosyal ihtiyaçların ayrılmaz bir parçası olan iş, eğitim, tatil, alışveriş, ziyaret gibi birçok alanda mekânsal tüketimi arttırmakta, kentleri yaşanılabilir kılmaktadır. Kent içi ulaşım, aslında bir ulaşım sorunundan daha çok "nasıl bir kent yaşamı istiyoruz", "İstediğimiz kenti yaratıyor muyuz" gibi soruların da yanıtlarını oluşturmaktadır. Çünkü ulaşım hizmeti depolanmadığı ve diğer sektörler ile çok sıkı bağlantılı olduğu için ihtiyaç duyulduğunda, toplumsal gereksinimler doğrultusunda planlanarak üretilmesi ve sunulması gerekmektedir. Ancak genel ekonomide tüketiciler ve üreticiler kararlarını piyasa koşullarına göre fiyat mekanizması yoluyla belirlerken, tüketiciler özel fayda analizi, üreticilerse özel maliyet analizi yapmakta, toplumsal fayda ve maliyetleri ise göz ardı etmektedirler. Çalışmanın amacı, gerek yazın taraması, gerekse nitel bir araştırma yöntemi ile kentleri, kent içi ulaşım hizmetleri bağlamında etkileyen negatif ve pozitif dışsallıklarını, genelde Türkiye'nin birçok kenti, özelde ise Çanakkale kenti bazında tespit ederek ortaya koymak olmuştur. Çalışmada aranan yanıt negatif dışsallıkların nasıl azaltılabileceği ya da ortadan kaldırılabileceği ve pozitif dışsallıkların nasıl artırılabilceğini "sürdürülebilir kent içi ulaşım" hizmetleri bağlamında ortaya koymaktır. Kent içi ulaşımında yaşanan negatif dışsallıkların birçok kentte canlı-cansız yaşamı artıran bir şekilde tehdit etmesi ise konunun önemini her geçen arttırmaktadır.
