The back of each page is deliberately blank so the students can focus using the same layout every week without fumbling with the book. While writing words or putting words in short sentences may be an option, we recommend using lined paper instead with the appropriately sized rows. One activity you might consider is having the students draw pictures of as many of the words as they can. You're creative, right? You'll figure something great to do with the back side of the pages. The pages are not perforated by design because many teachers have students turn in the entire book and some will not pass them back out until the following Monday when you are ready to introduce new words. Unfortunately, due to the randomization of the letters in each puzzle, it is possible that a "bad word" or two may exist throughout the book. At this grade level, students amazingly find them often before adults do. Obviously, you should discourage searching for those words, but don't make it an issue until it is one or they'll go out of their way to find words. The 2nd Grade book is a leap from the 1st Grade book. While the First Grade book has 8x8 rows and boxes around each letter, the 2nd Grade book 16 x 16 rows and does not have boxes around each letter. There are two reasons for this. The doubling of the rows happens because there are 20 words in each week's lesson instead of eight. The boxes are removed because students learn to be more self-sufficient if they need guidelines by using a piece of paper or a ruler, and then gradually they tend to adapt to needing nothing at all and work very well with the non-boxed letters. As grade levels go up,

the number of rows will range from 16 x 16 up to 29 x 29, and of course the words are grade level appropriate and get longer. The back of each page is deliberately blank so the students can focus using the same layout every week without fumbling with the book. While writing words or putting words in short sentences may be an option, we recommend using lined paper instead with the appropriately sized rows. One activity you might consider is having the students draw pictures of as many of the words as they can. You're creative, right? You'll figure something great to do with the back side of the pages. The pages are not perforated by design because many teachers have students turn in the entire book and some will not pass them back out until the following Monday when you are ready to introduce new words. This discourages students from working ahead. Don't want your students to be able to view the solutions at the back of the book?
