the ainsworth strange situation attachment styles consist of type a avoidant type b secure and type c ambivalent

the ainsworth strange situation findings indicated 70 of infants had secure attachment styles 15 had type a and 15 had type c the ainsworth strange situation evaluation suggests the research is highly reliable and has high temporal validity

*the strange situation research into attachment theory*

mary ainsworth was a pioneer in research into early attachment theory she became famous for her assessment technique in identifying different attachment styles in infants her technique was what became known as the strange situation the strange situation involved approximately 100 middle class american mothers and their infants

the ainsworth strange situation is a psychological experiment that tests the attachment of infants to their primary caregiver

it tests their anxiety levels and associated behaviors when

ainsworth and her colleagues created a

laboratory test that measured an infant's attachment to his or her parent. The test is called the strange situation technique because it is conducted in a context that is unfamiliar to the child and therefore likely to heighten the child's need for his or her parent. Ainsworth 1979

the American Canadian psychologist Mary Ainsworth (1913-1999) developed the strange situation procedure (SSP) to measure mother-child attachment and attachment theorists have used it ever since. When Ainsworth published the first results of the SSP in 1969, it seemed a completely novel and unique instrument.

In a letter to Everett Waters in 1985, Bowlby wrote of his intense pride at having had the opportunity to work with

Mary Ainsworth. He described Ainsworth and himself as horses in double harness pulling the cart along. This beautiful image of a sturdy, effortful partnership glosses over the fact that at times Bowlby and Ainsworth pulled in different directions.

### **strange situation wikipedia**

The strange situation is a procedure devised by Mary Ainsworth in the 1970s to observe attachment in children. That is, relationships between a caregiver and child. It applies to children between the age of nine and 30 months. Broadly speaking, the attachment styles were 1 secure and 2 insecure: ambivalent and avoidance.

Psychologist Mary Ainsworth devised an assessment technique called the strange situation classification (SSC) in order to investigate how

attachments might vary between children the strange situation was devised by ainsworth and wittig 1969 and was based on ainsworth s previous uganda 1967 and later baltimore studies ainsworth et al 1971 1978

ainsworth s strange situation 1970 used structured observational research to assess measure the quality of attachment it has 8 pre determined stages including the mother leaving the child for a short while to play with available toys in the presence of a stranger alone and the mother returning to the child stage 1 mother and child enter the playroom

introduced to the experimental room parent and infant are alone parent does not participate while infant explores stranger enters converses with parent then approaches infant

classifications are based primarily on interactive behaviors toward the mother in the two reunion episodes ep 5 ep 8 the term interactive behavior refers to behavior captured on four 7 point scales proximity seeking contact maintaining avoidance of proximity and contact and resistance to contact and comforting
