Together, Jones and Kreimer, with significant support from the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers, the union to which Jones belonged, began training guide dogs in Los Angeles. Hollywood stars soon took note of the charitable work being done by the school - where dogs and training are provided to students free of charge, and without assistance from any level of government - and lent their fame and fortune to the operation. John Wayne, Lucille Ball, Andy Griffith, Jonathan Winters, Clark Gable, Roy Rogers, Jackie Cooper and Betty White were among the first to become involved, setting a trend that continues to this day through the involvement of a new generation of stars, including Amanda Righetti, a star of CBS Television's "The Mentalist."
